

# A Quick Guide to...Padlet

## What is it?

Padlet is an online interactive + collaborative space where students and instructors may display created content, provide feedback, brainstorm, engage with one another around ideas using "sticky-note" style posts. Posts can be images, documents, videos, music, and files.

## How is it used in class?

- Discussions where students create a post based on a prompt and peers leave comments on their post
- Brainstorming space to generate ideas and organize a plan

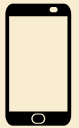

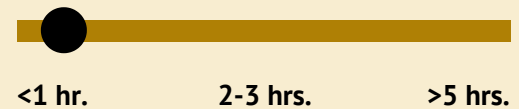
