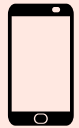

How is it used in class?

- Students and instructors can create a board for brainstorming.
- A board could be shared among the class for a class participation activity.

How is this beneficial to students & instructors?


Students

- Allows students a way to collaborate online and remotely.
- Easy way to plan out individual or group projects, mockups, storyboards, etc.
- On shared boards students can provide comments and feedback to help the other student grow and strengthen their plan.

Instructors

- Instructors can also use it as a way to collaborate with their peers.
- If the board is shared it can help instructors keep track of the progress of students to make sure that they are headed in the right direction.
